

# Internationally Accredited Schools in Costa Rica

Effective Date: April 2014



U.S. accreditation is critical for top quality private schools around the world. However, accreditation is a concept that few people understand and yet one from which many could benefit.

For top tier international schools worldwide, accreditation has responded to the 21<sup>st</sup> century need for improved **quality and greater accountability**.

The U.S. Department of Education describes approved accrediting organizations as a “**reliable authority as to the quality of education.**”

Accreditation is an external, objective validation of school quality and student achievement that fosters continuous school improvement.

**Accreditation provides a means for public accountability by:**

- Validating the integrity of a school's program and student transcripts.
- Assuring that the school's purposes are appropriate and accomplished through a viable educational program.
- Justifying the faith and resources others place in the school.

**Accreditation builds positive community and stakeholder relations by:**

- Providing opportunities to emphasize the positive and demonstrate the strength and effectiveness of the school.
- Broadening the staff view of community expectations and fostering closer school and community collaboration.
- Articulating and communicating opportunities between school levels and among stakeholder groups.

## Only Ten U.S. Accredited Schools in Costa Rica

There are only ten U.S. accredited schools in Costa Rica as of this date. Seven schools are accredited with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), one school is accredited with the Council of International Schools (CIS-NEASC), and two with the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA).

**Having an International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) Diploma Program authorization is not an accreditation.**

A school is authorized by the IBO to use their Diploma Program for Grades 11 and 12 at their school. There are 16 schools in Costa Rica that have IB Diploma Program authorization, though none of them are authorized to deliver the IB program from KG to Grade 10.



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*Having an IBO authorized school program is not a substitute for achieving an internationally recognized accreditation at your school.*
