Pre-requisites: Students applying to NHS must be 10-12th grade students who have attended CRIA for at least one semester. To be accepted, students must submit this completed form prior to the deadline, have a documented GPA of 3.0 or better, have 15 hours of community service hours completed within the past 6 months, documented by the deadline, have a quality character / clean record of school behavior, and submit 3 completed forms of recommendation from prior teachers. (Letters of recommendation via email may be substituted for the form.)

Requirements: Once a member, students are required to attend and participate in the induction ceremony, reciting a pledge where they promise to uphold the standards and principles of National Honor Society. New NHS members are required to earn 25 more hours of community service by the end of their entering semester, and 50 hours for each full year (25 hrs/semester). Students are also required to attend the weekly NHS meetings and assist and participate in NHS sponsored school and community events. Members must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or better for the entire school year.

Calculation of GPA: To calculate the GPA, core classes are worth 1 credit, so take the final semester grade and award 4 points for each A, 3 points for each B, 2 points for each C and 1 point for a D. PE and Art are half credits, so you would award 2 points for an A, 1.5 for a B, 1 for a C, and .5 for a D. Now total the number of points and divide by the number of credits. For many students the number of credits will be 6 (5 core credits and 2 half credits for PE/Art). Example: Student Stella got semester core class grades of 2 A's: 8 points; 3 B's: 9 points; and for half credits she got an A in Art: 2 points; a B in PE: 1.5 points for a total of 20.5 points. Divide by 6 total credits and her GPA would be 3.4.

Service Activities- Service generally includes those actions undertaken by the student that are done with, or on behalf of others without any direct financial or material compensation to the individual performing the service. Please list all recent community service or volunteer work that you have done in or out of school. CRIA National Honor Society requires a **MINIMUM OF 15 HOURS** of community service from the past 6 months prior to application deadline on **January 19th**. Twenty-five more hours must be completed by the end of May in order to remain in NHS. Once accepted, 25 hours of community service per semester is required to remain in good standing. If the following chart is not large enough, log sheets or signed correspondence will document the hours. Please have either the adult who supervised your activity or a parent or guardian sign or initial next to each experience listed.
