SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Costa Rica International Academy (formerly known as Country Day School Guanacaste) is the premier international school serving the international community in Guanacaste, Costa Rica. The 30 acre campus, steps from pristine beaches along the Pacific coast, opened its doors in 2000. The CRIA campus features a day program and offers a private, college-preparatory school enrolling approximately 285 students in Preschool through Grade 12. There are approximately 100 students in the high school. 35% of students at CRIA are U.S. citizens, 30% Costa Rican citizens, and the remainder are citizens from 22 other nations. Costa Rica International Academy is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and the Costa Rican Ministry of Education. Both the U.S. high school and the Costa Rican *Bachillerato* programs are offered, and diplomas are awarded for each. Students in the high school pursue a U.S.-based curriculum. The language of instruction is English, and the average class size is 16.

GPA and RANK

GPA is calculated over a four-year period of grades 9-12. Due to the small number of students in the class and the multicultural and varied scholastic backgrounds of our population, we do not rank our students.

AP and HONORS COURSES

CRIA offers AP courses which may include: Chemistry, Biology, Statistics, Calculus AB, Macroeconomics, Spanish Language and Culture, U.S. History and Environmental Science. In addition, CRIA may offer the following honors courses: Algebra I, Calculus and Marine Biology. On average, CRIA students take 2-3 AP courses throughout their high school years. In May of 2016, 17 AP exams were written and a score of 3, 4 or 5 was earned on 82% of the exams. In May of 2017, 23 AP exams were written and a score of 3, 4, or 5 was earned on 70% of the exams.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

CRIA offers extracurricular activities such as Model United Nations, student government, National Honor Society, yearbook, chess club, community service, and SAT preparation. Sports include varsity soccer, varsity volleyball (girls); competitive track, swimming, surfing, and basketball.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Students demonstrating exemplary scholarship, leadership, and service are invited to become members of CRIA's chapter of the National Honor Society.

COSTA RICAN *BACHILLERATO* PROGRAM

The Costa Rican *Bachillerato* program (grade 11) is the Costa Rican Ministry of Education's secondary school credential. This program and diploma enables students to study at universities in Costa Rica. Students may opt for the United States Credential, the Costa Rican *Bachillerato* Credential, or both. In the last two years, 100% of CRIA students who sat for the *Bachillerato*, earned the credential.

Mathematics	3 credits	Math credits may include Algebra I, Alg. II, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, AP or Honors Calculus AB
Science	3 credits	Science credits may include Biology, Physics, Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, Marine Biology. Two sciences must include a laboratory class
Languages	3 credits	Language credits may include Spanish (Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced), AP Spanish Language and Culture, or other Foreign Language course
Fine Arts	1 credit	Fine Arts credits may include Art, Music, Theatre/Drama, Digital Photography and Videography
PE	1 credit	Students must complete 1 PE credit in Grades 9-12
Core Electives	6 credits	Elective credits may be chosen from previously listed courses and accredited online providers such as K12 and Virtual High School*
